## 20230507 - THE DIRECTION OF THE COUNCIL

Sunday AM – Acts 15:19-41

#### I. THE DECISION

- A. The matter of works for salvation is heard in its entirety
  - 1. Things were done decently and in order!
    - a. <u>1 COR. 14:31</u> "For ye may all prophesy one by one, that all may learn, and all may be comforted."
    - b. Meetings of a church(es) should NEVER get out of control!
    - c. MATT. 7:20 "Wherefore by their fruits ye shall know them."
    - d. <u>GAL. 5:22-23</u> "But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, longsuffering, gentleness, goodness, faith, (23) meekness, temperance: against such there is no law."
  - 2. And James gives his opinion (Peter is the Pastor at Jerusalem)
    - a. He gives HIS sentence (vs. 19)
      - i. It's okay to have an opinion
      - ii. BASED UPON SCRIPTURE AND REASON
      - iii. If you base it on emotion, you WILL go wrong!
    - b. SO many people want to have their emotions heard
    - c. SO many people want to tell their side of the story
    - d. Maybe the answer is to stop and listen rather than speaking
  - 3. <u>PSA. 46:10</u> "Be still, and know that I am God: I will be exalted among the heathen, I will be exalted in the earth."
  - 4. <u>MATT. 6:7</u> "But when ye pray, use not vain repetitions, as the heathen do: for they think that they shall be heard for their much speaking."
- B. Four preachers speak at the council
  - 1. And yet SOMEHOW an agreement was reached!
    - a. Peter, Paul, Barnabas, and James
    - b. Each gave a Gospel MESSAGE!
      - i. Peter preaches about God's work among them (vs. 7)
      - ii. Paul and Barnabas about the mission field (vs. 12)
      - iii. James about answered prophecy (vs. 15)
    - c. Each PERTAINED to the exact discussion at hand!
  - 2. Testimony meetings can be wonderful but also a little dangerous
    - a. You never know what someone will end up saying
    - b. Bro. Shepherd's Hurricane Thank You Dinner
    - c. It was about the HURRICANE!
    - d. But some guy stood up (no one knew) stands up
      - i. And tells a long and involved story
      - ii. That seemed a little questionable
      - iii. And (it turned out) happened YEARS ago!!!
      - iv. Don't be that guy!

- 3. Don't relitigate the troubles of the past, tell what God is doing TODAY
- 4. Be a blessing not an attention seeker
- C. James recommends that they TROUBLE NOT the Gentile believers
  - 1. First, it is CONFIRMED once again that works cannot buy Salvation
    - a. <u>ISA. 64:6</u> "But we are all as an unclean thing, and all our righteousnesses are as filthy rags; and we all do fade as a leaf; and our iniquities, like the wind, have taken us away."
    - b. <u>EPH. 2:8</u> "For by grace are ye saved through faith; and that not of yourselves: it is the gift of God:"
      - i. By the way, the GIFT there is GRACE, not faith!
      - ii. Don't listen to the Calvinist error
      - iii. It's simple sentence structure, what is the SUBJECT?
    - c. Salvation is by the FINISHED WORK of Jesus Christ EXCLUSIVELY
  - 2. James says REMOVE and ABSTAIN from heathen practices (vs. 29)
    - a. Get away from idols
    - b. Keep separated from the death-cults and blood pagans
    - c. Abhor Satanic sacrifices (God used blood, strangled is opposite)
    - d. Separate from immoral sexuality and fornication
    - e. These rules still apply to us TODAY
  - 3. That is NOT LEGALISM!
    - a. Legalism is not even in this ballpark!
    - b. Legalism is trying to purchase Salvation by following the Law
    - c. This is SANCTIFICATION, trying to live a separated life
    - d. Not for Salvation but because OF Salvation
    - e. A life that is pleasing to Jesus Christ, our Lord and Savior!

# II. THE DOCUMENTS

- A. The recommendation is approved by the Church at Jerusalem (vs. 22)
  - 1. And they send out an official letter owning the problems
    - a. There's a lot of wrong thinking about this passage
    - b. That the "Apostles" created a new doctrine here and sent it out
    - c. This was one church DISAVOWING error to all the others! (vs. 24)
  - 2. The Judaizers purported themselves to be sent out from Jerusalem
  - 3. And therefore, the Church at Jerusalem took responsibility and fixed it!
- B. They chose FAITHFUL men to carry the letters
  - 1. Not just hirelings, not just a few members around the periphery
  - 2. These were mature pillars of the church actually, PREACHERS (vs. 32)
    - a. Proven men of God
    - b. Christians with unmistakable character
    - c. Not novices or anyone with more zeal than knowledge
  - 3. They wanted to make sure the letters were received in full authenticity
- C. The letter contained a many elements
  - 1. A greeting and exhortation in the faith (vs. 23)

- 2. An admission of the problem and the source (vs. 24)
- 3. A direct unanimous decision to make the truth known (vs. 25)
- 4. A list of credentials for the men being sent (vs. 26 & 27)
- 5. God's message that they all agreed upon and supported (vs. 28)
- D. Judas and Silas preached and witnessed to this fact (vs. 32)

## III. THE DEPARTURE

- A. Judas went back to Jerusalem (or onward with the letters)
  - 1. But Silas stayed in Antioch to preach and work with them (vs. 34)
  - 2. Paul and Barnabas stayed there too and preached
    - a. Perhaps they were still undoing the damage done by bad doctrine
    - b. Remember, they were shocked to hear the error in vs. 2
    - c. Missionaries come home to report all the time and are surprised
  - 3. That should NEVER happen!
    - a. Endeavor to be a church that can be flexible with the times
    - b. But unchanging and SOLID in doctrine and practice!
- B. Finally, Paul starts to get a longing for the mission field again
  - 1. He was called of God after all!
  - 2. <u>ROM. 11:29</u> "For the gifts and calling of God are without repentance."
  - 3. Christians who will not obey what God tells them are MISERABLE
- C. Paul tells Barnabas, we need to get back out there and see how they do
  - 1. Let's go see what God has done among His people
    - a. Do they need help? Are they following the Word of God
    - b. Maybe more churches need to be organized out there
    - c. Mission works become churches that should start more churches
  - 2. Visit "our brethren" in every city (vs. 36)
    - a. There was once a man named "Saul" who wouldn't have said that
    - b. Certainly not about Gentiles!
    - c. What a WONDERFUL change in Paul's life has been wrought!
  - 3. This was the guy who would haul Christian's to jail and death
  - 4. Now he's concerned about how their doing in the faith!

# IV. THE DIVISION

- A. But things don't always go well sometimes personalities get into the picture
  - 1. Between these GODLY men came a dispute over John Mark (vs. 37)
    - a. They had probably planned and discussed their route
    - b. They probably ordered a shipping container full of John/Romans
    - c. They purchased their plane tickets
    - d. But then Barnabas said, "Oh, I bought a ticket for Mark"
    - e. And Paul wouldn't have it (thought it "not good" vs. 38)
  - 2. John Mark had been with them on the field <u>ACTS 13:5</u>
    - a. He was there to help them but then he left <u>ACTS 13:13</u>

- b. It happened to Paul more than once, but he learned patience
- c. And he learned forgiveness
- d. <u>2 TIM. 4:10</u> "For Demas hath forsaken me, having loved this present world, and is departed unto Thessalonica; Crescens to Galatia, Titus unto Dalmatia."
- e. And then the very next verse is key!
- f. <u>2 TIM. 4:11</u> "Only Luke is with me. Take Mark, and bring him with thee: for he is profitable to me for the ministry."
- 3. Older folks, just because young people sometimes make mistakes
  - a. Don't give up on them!
  - b. Young people, just because you made a mistake
  - c. Don't give up on yourself, get back and try again!
- B. Barnabas, the encourager, was ready to give John Mark another chance
  - 1. And praise God Barnabas did!
  - 2. While we never hear about Barnabas again (vs. 39)
  - 3. We wouldn't have <u>2 TIM. 4:11</u> without the encouragement of Barnabas!
- C. God's Word still profited despite our human frailties
  - <u>ROM. 8:28</u> "And we know that all things work together for good to them that love God, to them who are the called according to his purpose."
  - 2. Now there are not one, but TWO missionary teams sent out of Antioch!
  - 3. God still got the glory!

### V. THE DEVOTION

- A. What was it all about?
  - 1. They loved the present world (Demas and Mark leaving the mission field)
  - 2. They refused to give up their religiousity (Judaizers)
  - 3. They dabbled in paganism (Gentiles)
- B. God wants your heart, not part of it but all of it
  - 1. If you are Saved, get rid of all the worldly things in your life!
  - 2. If it is an idol, it must go! If it is a false god, it must go!
  - 3. If it takes you away from church, it must go!
  - 4. If it keeps you from reading your Bible, it must go!
- C. If you aren't Saved, then you don't have a relationship with God
  - 1. But you can!
  - 2. Turn your back on yourself and your sin and this present world
  - 3. And turn to Him
  - 4. Be Saved Today!
