# FAMILY MATTERS #7 - HAVEN OF THE FAMILY

# LUKE 15:11-24

Friends will fail but not family. Christian homes should be havens in life's storms for all who keep humble and repentant.

# I. WEATHERING TO REST

- A. HAVEN "A shelter; an asylum; a place of safety."
- B. The Prodigal Son returned home
  - 1. Remember he was a SON (picture of the saved)
  - 2. Father waited for him, ran to him, kissed him
- C. Why did the Prodigal return? He remembered (vs. 17)
- D. There is no rest is storms without Christ MATT. 8:24
  - 1. If He's not worried, we shouldn't be worried
  - 2. Home should be commodious to winter ACTS 27:12
  - 3. Or the prodigal might risk going somewhere else

# II. WEATHERING IN RIGHTOUSNESS

- A. Commodious does not mean compromising! 2 COR. 6:14-18
  - 1. Things that are different are not the same
  - 2. It is written: "Be ye holy; for I am holy
  - 3. Fellowship requires fellows-in-the-ship!
- B. Dwelling together = wintering in a haven (vs. 16)
- C. Family explains fellowship/relationship (vs. 18)

# III. WEATHERING IN REFRESHMENT

- A. Consider trees by the river vs. in the desert PSA. 1:3
  - 1. Children fruitful around the table PSA. 128:3
  - 2. Sons and daughters NOURSISHED PSA. 144:12
- B. Exhort and comfort and charge 1 THESS. 2:1-12
  - 1. Paul said they spoke BOLDLY the Gospel (vs. 2)
  - 2. Paul did not DECEIVE or trick (vs. 3)
  - 3. Paul did not PLEASE but gave truth (vs. 4)
  - 4. Paul did not flatter (vs. 5)
  - 5. Paul was gentle as a nurse (vs. 6)
  - 6. Paul considered their souls dear (vs. 8)
  - 7. Paul an example of justice and holiness (vs. 10)
- C. Should not the family be the same? (vs. 11)
  - 1. As a father and a nurse teaching and watching
  - 2. Why? One stated goal walking worthy of God

CONCLUSION: The Christian home should be a little piece of heaven for the children and a place of rest for the parents.
