20190609 - UNEXPECTED CONTRASTS

Sunday AM – John 1:6-14

I. THE INTRODUCTION OF JOHN THE BAPTIST

- a. We meet a man sent from God
 - i. We will learn more about him over the next few weeks
 - 1. We will learn of his witness
 - 2. We will learn of his record
 - 3. We will learn what he saw
 - ii. Today we know three things about John (vs. 6)
 - 1. We know his name (meaning "gracious")
 - 2. We know that he was a man (a real man)
 - 3. We know that he was sent from God
 - iii. He was a witness. A messenger.
 - 1. His message and mission given by God
 - 2. His credentials and instructions given by God
 - 3. Scripture records no miracles
 - 4. Scripture records no visions or revelations
 - 5. A single-minded focus
- b. A prophet foretold
 - Mal. 3:1 Behold, I will send my messenger, and he shall prepare the way before me: and the Lord, whom ye seek, shall suddenly come to his temple, even the messenger of the covenant, whom ye delight in: behold, he shall come, saith the LORD of hosts.
 - ii. He came for one reason only
 - iii. For a TESTIMONY
 - 1. The Tabernacle was a testimony
 - 2. The Ark was a testimony
 - 3. The Law was a testimony
 - 4. And Jesus Christ is a testimony!
 - iv. A testimony, bearing WITNESS of that Light! (vs. 7)

- c. He was not that light (vs. 8)
 - i. But came to point to the TRUE light (vs. 9)
 - ii. Not that John the Baptist was a false light
 - iii. But that Christ is the Light (i.e. Sun and Moon)
 - iv. John the Baptist REFLECTED that light
 - v. And so should we!
 - vi. He did not speak about himself
 - I Cor. 1:23-24 We preach Christ crucified, unto the Jews a stumbling block, and unto the Greeks foolishness; but unto them which are called, both Jews and Greeks, Christ the power of God, and the wisdom of God.
 - 2. Preaching is the plan!
- d. I am struck by three statements in this passage
 - i. And the world knew Him not (vs. 10)
 - ii. And His own received Him not (vs. 11)
 - iii. But of God (vs. 13)

II. AND THE WORLD KNEW HIM NOT

- a. Last week we spoke on the subject of Light
 - i. I John 1:5 This then is the message which we have heard of him, and declare unto you, that God is light, and in him is no darkness at all.

ii. There is no light outside of Jesus

The whole world was lost in the darkness of sin; The light of the world is Jesus!
Like sunshine at noonday, His glory shone in; The light of the world is Jesus!
Come to the light, 'tis shining for thee; Sweetly the light, has dawned upon me;
Once I was blind, but now I can see; The light of the world is Jesus!

- iii. He is IT! There is NONE else!
 - 1. After many of the unbelievers left, Peter had this answer
 - John 6:67 Then Simon Peter answered him, Lord, to whom shall we go? Thou has the words of eternal life.
- b. It is Condemnation
 - i. John 3:19 And this is the condemnation, that light is come into the world, and men loved darkness rather than light, because their deeds were evil.
 - ii. Condemnation The act of condemning; the judicial act of declaring one guilty, and dooming him to punishment.
 - 1. Condemnation implies a judgement
 - 2. Judgement implies a JUDGE!
 - 3. The world like the quote only one verse in the Bible
 - a. Matt. 7:1 Judge not, that ye be not judged.
 - b. No need to judge what God has already determined!
 - c. God is the Judge!
 - d. His Word is full of judgements! 🙂
 - e. We must simply obey what He has said already.
- c. The World Cannot Comprehend Him
 - i. "Knew" (vs. 5 / 10)
 - 1. Not that they doubt His existence
 - a. They know He lived
 - b. They accept historical facts as they want to see them
 - c. But they do not "know" Him
 - 2. Caves

- a. If you are looking for a light, you will see it
- b. If you refuse to open your eyes, you will stumble in darkness
- ii. He is the Light, and the World does not see Him

III. HIS OWN RECEIVED HIM NOT

- a. Isaiah 9:6 For unto us a child is born, unto us a son is given...
 - i. He was sent unto God's people
 - ii. And they refused Him!
- b. John 19:13-15
 - i. We have no King but Caesar!
- c. They tried to trick Him
 - i. They tried to ridicule Him
 - ii. They tried to trap Him
 - iii. They tried to mock Him
 - iv. They tried to stone Him
 - v. They NEVER tried to RECEIVE HIM!

IV. BUT OF GOD

- a. Many did not receive Him (maybe "most")
 - i. But Praise God SOME did!
 - ii. To all that did, He ADOPTED
 - iii. I was once an orphan to sin...
 - iv. But HE made me a SON of GOD
 - v. He came looking for me
 - 1. He loved me when I was unlovely
 - 2. He loved me when I was doomed in sin
 - 3. He loved me when I was a rebel from righteousness
 - 4. He loved me when I was hopeless and helpless

- 5. He loved ME
- b. How did they receive Him? (vs. 12)
 - i. They believed on His name!
 - 1. Simple as that
 - 2. Plus nothing and minus nothing
 - ii. Romans 10:9 That if thou shalt confess with they mouth the Lord Jesus, and shalt believe in thine heart that God hath raised him from the dead, thou shalt be saved.
- c. Born not by... (vs. 13)
 - i. Not of blood
 - 1. No one is saved because of their family
 - 2. God has no grandchildren
 - ii. Not by the will of the flesh
 - 1. No good works (so called)
 - 2. Not by the strength of human acts
 - iii. Not by the will of man
 - 1. No one can will themselves to be saved
 - 2. A desire is not enough (a wish without repentance)
 - iv. Only of GOD
 - 1. He is the only one that can save!
 - 2. The opposite of all of those things! (Look at this!)
 - a. By HIS blood
 - b. By HIS acts
 - c. By HIS will
- d. How did He do it?
 - i. The Word was made flesh (vs. 14)
 - ii. He was full of grace and full of truth

V. HOW HE SAVES

a. The Bible there tells us of His grace and truth

- b. Both are needed
 - i. His truth (the Bible) tells us that we are all sinners
 - ii. His grace makes a way for all sinners to be saved
- c. It won't be from your pedigree, your practices, nor your prerogatives
- d. It will be only through His truth, and by His grace.
- e. He is the light, will you know Him?
- f. He wants you for His own, will you receive Him?
